2019 PRIORITIES



IMMIGRATION

Promote policies that provide a timely path to US citizenship for law-abiding, tax-paying newcomers.

Advocate for comprehensive immigration reform that includes a balanced approach which protects national security, unites families, strengthens borders, provides immigrant youth with educational opportunities, and promotes the civic integration of newcomers.

Advocate for the reduction of visa backlogs and a path to citizenship for Temporary Protected Status (TPS) grantees.

Support the protection of Dream Act legislation that would give young teen and adult students who have grown up in the United States the means to remain in the country without fear of removal.

Call for a full and accurate count of the nation's second largest population. We believe accurate data about the Latino community is critical for our country's economic, social and civic well-being.

Support California and its cities right to protect and advocate for its undocumented communities.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Advocate for the increase of state and federal financial support, the reduction of regulatory barriers, and support additional incentives and local financial tools to address the affordability of housing and increase the availability of affordable housing to all California residents.

TRANSPORTATION

Advocate for access to safe and affordable transportation to all California communities.

Call for the equitable distribution of State funding for critical transportation systems and infrastructure programs which seek to address the transportation needs of workers, super-commuters, students, elderly and low-income families.

Seek to promote innovative state, local, and public private partnerships to address issues of equity and means based programs which address the complex and unaddressed transportation needs of low-income/disadvantaged commuters.

To help local Latino representatives successfully involve and mobilize their community in local public decision-making.




LATINO NEW MAYORS AND COUNCIL MEMBER TRAINING
